

If you are in law school taking a course on Secured Transactions (UCC Article 9), this is a great commercial outline for getting a clear, succinct overview of the material. It explains the provisions of UCC Article 9 in plain English while also providing the perfect amount of legal policy analysis that you can use to impress your professor in class or on a final exam.

This is an overall decent product, but because of the reliance students place on Gilbert's being superb, mistakes should not be allowed for.1) The capsule summary clearly misses important info that you would want in the capsule, some of which is captured in the full text, some of which isn't2) The full text has clear missing info when checked against the UCC. I am referring to testable material. The examples/context in the text are also lacking. The one positive about this book is the organizational structure. Overall, its decent to use, but can be a pitfall if relied upon.

This commercial outline was the perfect review for my secured trans class. The organization of the book was great, and I liked how it broke down topics in a clear and understandable manner. While it

certainly doesn't cover all of the intricacies in article 9 (still have to look at the code), it does a good job of showing the bigger picture and serves as a great review.

This is a good review guide if you are really looking for an outline and not something that will guide you through the material. If you need to basically learn secured transactions from scratch you should probably get another book and use this to help fill in the gaps.

Everything you need to understand Secured Transactions is in this book. Lucky for me, as I need all the help I can get in that class.
